Currently, JLA's education initiatives include the Journey to Literacy program where it partners with local libraries to increase early literacy skills through events with both children and parents. Children participating in the program have received more than 3,000 books to foster learning at home. The work to promote early learning has extended in recent years to participating as a sponsor of Georgia Pre-K Week and the Mayor's Summer Reading Club, just to name a few.
