



The Junior League of Atlanta, Inc. (“JLA”) is committed to advocacy as it relates to Georgia’s women and children, especially those living in under-resourced communities, and outlines the following areas of focus:

- I. **Equity:** JLA supports policies and initiatives that remove barriers to success because of a person’s race, color, religion, gender, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, national origin, or ethnicity; including, but not limited to efforts related to:
  - A. Promoting the well-being of communities which have been historically marginalized and faced discrimination in Atlanta and the rest of our state.
  - B. Addressing the root causes of generational poverty.
  - C. Environmental protections necessary for the health and well-being of Georgia's citizens.
  - D. Increasing access to healthy and affordable foods in communities with high poverty rates and/or incidence of food insecurity.
  - E. Increasing access to affordable housing.
  - F. Improving supplier diversity.
  - G. Criminal justice reform measures aimed at ensuring equity before the law and that work to keep families intact.
  - H. Education regarding and access to voter registration and voting locations, including mail-in voting.
  
- II. **Education:** JLA supports policies and initiatives that strengthen education in Georgia, including, but not limited to efforts related to:
  - A. Ensuring all students reach critical education milestones, including, but not limited to, being ready for Kindergarten, 3rd grade reading proficiency, high school graduation, and post-secondary enrollment and completion.
  - B. Improving access to and funding for Quality Rated preschool and early learning programs.
  - C. Creating and sustaining constructive extended-learning programs, including before- and after-school programming, summer learning programs, vocational training and adult learning programs.
  - D. Promoting family engagement in schools.
  - E. Early learning and family literacy programs.
  
- III. **Health:** JLA supports policies and initiatives that promote the health and well-being of Georgia’s women and children, including, but not limited to efforts related to:
  - A. Improving access to and increasing funding for high-quality, comprehensive, and preventative mental and physical health care.
  - B. Access to comprehensive health education, training, research, diagnosis and support.

- C. The appropriation and authorization of funds, which support the operation of state agencies and county health departments throughout Georgia.
  - D. Building an enhanced statewide trauma network that helps ensure that patients are treated in a timely manner in the most appropriate trauma care setting.
  - E. The awareness of and education through nutritional and fitness programs.
  - F. The expansion and funding of programs that promote the health of infants and mothers.
- IV. **Aid and Protection:** JLA supports policies and initiatives that offer aid and protection to Georgia's women and children, including, but not limited to efforts related to:
- A. Accessible, affordable and high-quality child care for all families.
  - B. Collaborative efforts between public agencies that are involved with and have an impact on children.
  - C. The protection of women and children from violence and related crimes, and assistance for those who have been victims of crimes.
  - D. Eliminating hunger and homelessness.
  - E. Ending Commercial Sexual Exploitation and Human Trafficking (CSE/HT).
  - F. Increasing education and awareness of CSE/HT.
  - G. Supporting the victims of CSE/HT.
  - H. Increasing education and awareness of financial literacy issues.
